<b>Description</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>▪ Short survey developed to get positive activity feedback</li> <li>▪ Based on activity components</li> <li>▪ Typically quickly done</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>▪ Short to Mid-length survey developed to provide activity feedback</li> <li>▪ Based on activity components</li> <li>▪ Typically built from previous examples</li> <li>▪ Sometimes addresses specific activity objectives</li> <li>▪ May include tracking of participants</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>▪ Mid-length survey developed to provide activity feedback and to understand impact of program</li> <li>▪ Incorporates activity feedback with some feedback on efficacy of activity as measured by goals, objectives and outcomes</li> <li>▪ Includes at least short term tracking of participants</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>▪ Longer survey developed to measure objectives and outcomes of an activity</li> <li>▪ Incorporates assessment of efficacy of activity as measured by goals, objectives and outcomes with some formative activity feedback</li> <li>▪ Includes short and long term tracking of participants</li> </ul>
<b>Typical Use</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>▪ Shape activities and planning</li> <li>▪ Provide good feedback for reports</li> <li>▪ Fulfill assessment requirement</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>▪ Typically seen as providing formative data</li> <li>▪ Test popularity or effectiveness of activity components</li> <li>▪ Provide feedback for reports</li> <li>▪ Change/improve activity to make more popular or effective based on participant opinions</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>▪ Gather formative data with some summative attributes</li> <li>▪ Test effectiveness of activity components against objectives</li> <li>▪ Test immediate impact of activity on participants</li> <li>▪ Change or improve activity to make it more effective</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>▪ Gather summative and formative data</li> <li>▪ Test efficacy of overall activity and activity components against objectives</li> <li>▪ Test immediate and long-term impact of activity on participants</li> <li>▪ Change or improve activity to make it more effective based on objectives and outcomes</li> </ul>
<b>Value</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>▪ PR Tool</li> <li>▪ Data unvalidated</li> <li>▪ Can provide formative data</li> <li>▪ Easily recorded data</li> <li>▪ Easy to develop, implement, score, record &amp; summarize</li> <li>▪ May not need to keep completed copies on hand</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>▪ Good PR Tool</li> <li>▪ Data unvalidated</li> <li>▪ Provide formative data</li> <li>▪ Can improve offerings</li> <li>▪ Easily recorded data</li> <li>▪ Easy to develop, implement, score, record &amp; summarize</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>▪ Good PR Tool</li> <li>▪ Data sometimes validated</li> <li>▪ Provide formative and partial assessment data</li> <li>▪ Provide data that may improve ability of activity to meet objectives, outcomes</li> <li>▪ Somewhat easily recorded data</li> <li>▪ Viewed as more sophisticated</li> <li>▪ Good for conference publications; grant proposals; reports to corporations and stakeholders ; internal reports</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>▪ Great PR Tool</li> <li>▪ Data validated and tested</li> <li>▪ Provide reliable assessment information</li> <li>▪ Reliable and outcomes-based planning tool for future activities</li> <li>▪ Provide data that can improve ability to meet objectives and desired outcomes</li> <li>▪ Allow meaningful data analysis &amp; summative evaluation</li> <li>▪ Good for scholarly publications as well as conference publications; grant proposals; reports to corporations and stakeholders ; internal reports</li> </ul>
<b>Problems</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>▪ Typically doesn't address objectives</li> <li>▪ Provides information that cannot be use to identify or measure outcomes</li> <li>▪ Can be misleading if taken as true assessment</li> <li>▪ Increasingly viewed as unsophisticated by funders</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>▪ Typically doesn't address long range objectives</li> <li>▪ Standard of change is based upon participant satisfaction rather than achieved goals</li> <li>▪ Fails to measure impact of activity on participants or in depth objectives</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>▪ Fails to reliably capture assessment of desired outcomes</li> <li>▪ Fails to reliably assess impact on participant</li> <li>▪ Incomplete assessment of the activity</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>▪ Data recording more complex</li> <li>▪ Requires long-term planning and resources</li> </ul>
